RE: City Council Review of Public Works Standards (PWS) Update

Summary:

The September 13, 2016 Special Council meeting includes a discussion on the Public Works Standards (the Standards). The intent of the presentation is to provide a summary of the information included in the Standards and the changes recommended by the City Council and staff. Time will be dedicated for Council discussion and questions.

Background:

The Public Works Standards are a comprehensive policy document that establishes development requirements and consistency for all projects constructed in the City.

The current Interim Standards were adopted on April 19, 2000 by Ordinance No. O2000-60 and have not been modified or updated since their initial adoption. Staff are currently working to update the adopted Standards with the following goals in mind:

- *Improve organization and formatting of the document*
- *Improve clarity and consistency with the City Code and other policies*
- *Coordinate the Standards with other plans, such as the Trails, Bikeways & Paths Plan (non-motorized plan)*
- *Update the Standards based on feedback from recent Hearing Examiner decisions*
- *Maintain compatibility with regional, State and Federal regulations*

The update began in April of 2015 and has been reviewed by City staff, the Planning Commission and the public. Key areas of focus for the update and previous discussions include:

- *Street Classifications*
- *Roadway sections for local roads*
- *Connectivity*
- *Connection to substandard streets*
- *Right-of-Way Street Tree List*
- *Deviations from Public Works Standards and Process*

The Planning Commission completed their review of the Standards in June and recommends adoption.

Initial Comment from City Council:

In an attempt to facilitate an efficient process, City Council members were asked to provide initial comments in advance of the meeting on Tuesday. The comments and questions received will be incorporated into upcoming Council presentations and discussions. We welcome and encourage ongoing feedback as we work to finalize the document and prepare for adoption.

The current version of the Public Works Standards are posted on the City website for review and comment. There are two versions posted on the web site. One version shows the redline comments made since the City Council meeting held June 28, 2016. The standard details that accompany the Public Works Standards will be up on the website by the end of business on Friday for review. We are looking forward to the discussion Tuesday night.
