

These future doctors will practice suturing stitches and administering first aid; they will learn about the heart, lungs, bones, brain, spine, eyes, digestion, and how pharmacists play a role in prescribing medicine.

PARKS PLANNING

City has preferred master plan designs for two new parks: Beaton Hill Park and Big Rock Park South

The New Parks

Beaton Hill Park is located approximately half a mile west of City Hall. The park is made up of two parcels that were purchased by the City in 2018. The property is named after the family that owned the farmstead for over 80 years. The vacant property totals 9.36 acres and is directly north of the three Big Rock Park properties (North, Central, and South).


Big Rock Park South is located on SE 20th St and is the third and final property of a 51-acre phased land donation by Mary Pigott. The first two parcels, North and Central, opened to the public in 2016 and 2021. Like the conditions placed on the previous two parcels, this 15-acre park will facilitate a variety of low impact active and passive activities.

Master Plan Process

Prior to commencing development or improvement on parkland, a master plan is completed by following the City's master plan process, which looks at the parkland comprehensively by involving the entire community. The process consists of three phases:

- Phase 1: Site Investigation and Analysis Complete
- Phase 2: Park Program (Proposed Amenities and Site Character) – Complete
- Phase 3: Master Plan Development Complete

Two to three alternatives were prepared for each park, based upon the approved park program. Based upon feedback from the community, Parks & Recreation Commission, and City Council, the alternatives were revised to one preferred design for each park. The end product will be a Master Plan Report for each park. Funds for implementing the master plans may be budgeted for in the future following adoption by City Council. Improvements to the parks may be completed in phases over time.



Facilities

The City of Sammamish offers two facilities available for events, weddings, birthday parties, reunions, meetings, etc. The Lodge offers an enclosed venue with log cabin charm and space to accommodate groups up to 150. The Pavilion is a beautiful open-air facility offering a stunning lake view as a backdrop for your special occasion and space to accommodate groups up to 100. Both facilities are available to rent year-round.

Beaver Lake Lodge

Overlooking Beaver Lake and surrounded by open grass areas, the Lodge offers a rustic log-cabin feel and quiet atmosphere that works for any occasion. The 1,850 sq. ft. main room accommodates 150 people seated and has a gas fireplace. The kitchen includes a convection oven, stove top/oven and double-size refrigerator. Rental also includes the use of round tables, rectangular tables and chairs.

Beaver Lake Pavilion


This 2,500 sq. ft. open-air facility boasts high ceilings, an unbeatable lake view and a large, stone fireplace. This facility works great as a stand-alone rental and also serves as a fantastic



complement for events held at the Beaver Lake Lodge. Six picnic tables and a barbecue grill are available for your use. The picnic tables may be moved to accommodate the needs of your group. Capacity is 100 people.

Treehouse Open Houses

The Treehouse will be open for visitors four times per month from March through October. These dates and times are posted online.


